



## Stanley Curtis

Stanley Curtis grew up on a farm in northern Indiana. He earned three degrees in animal sciences at Purdue University. He held professorships at Missouri and Penn State universities and for 20 years at the University of Illinois, where he now works again in semi-retirement. He and his students and colleagues have investigated fundamental and practical aspects of animal-environment relations across a wide front. He wrote a textbook on farm-animal ecology and hundreds of scientific papers, book chapters, monographs, and trade-press articles. He has made more than 800 invited presentations to diverse audiences all over the world. He is past president of American Society of Animal Science and of Federation of Animal Science Societies and a Fellow of ASAS. He edited the charter *Guide for the Care and Use of Agricultural Animals in Agricultural Research and Teaching* and chaired the charter scientific advisory committee to the USDA Animal Welfare Information Center as well as the Association for Assessment and Accreditation of Laboratory Animal Care International (AAALAC). He is considered to be an authority on scientific aspects of the state of being of farm animals.
